The Hopeful Futures Campaign, powered by Inseparable, is active in driving both state and federal legislation and regulations that promote the coverage and delivery of effective school mental health services and that support healthy school climates.

The Hopeful Futures Campaign supports effective, evidence-based, and evidence-informed interventions but does not endorse specific companies or their commercial products.

Our Hopeful Futures Campaign partners are expected to embrace the campaign's policy goals and bolster legislative efforts to support youth-focused and school mental health systems and programs. We ask that partners contribute to the success of the Hopeful Futures Campaign through active participation in campaign meetings, where we discuss state and federal legislation, partners' work, and key topics related to campaign priorities. In addition, partners are expected to lend their support to campaign priorities through means that best reflects an organization's strengths and capacity, such as:
